11.	16 July 1943	Me-109		engagement which developed against 36 enemy aircraft (30 Ju-88, 6 Me-109). There were six Yak-1 on our side. After the victory over the "Junkers" she engaged two Messerschmitts, one of which was shot down. She was wounded, but returned to formation and

				continued to fight. She was wounded for a second time and shot down; she landed gear-up. Refused to go to the hospital.
12.	19 July 1943	Me-109		She was escorting II-2s. Battle occurred repulsing an attack by enemy fighters.
13.	21 July 1943	Me-109		As part of a 4-ship of Yak-1s in a battle against 12 Messerschmitts. In a pair with regimental commander I. Golyshev she fought against seven Messerschmitts. She was directly engaged with three. She shot down one of four that were attacking I. Golyshev.
14.	1 August 1943		Me-109	Third sortie of that day. As part of a group engaged with superior enemy forces.
15.	1 August 1943	Me-109		Fourth sortie of the day. As part of six of ours in battle against 42 fascist aircraft. In this battle L. LITVIAK was killed.
